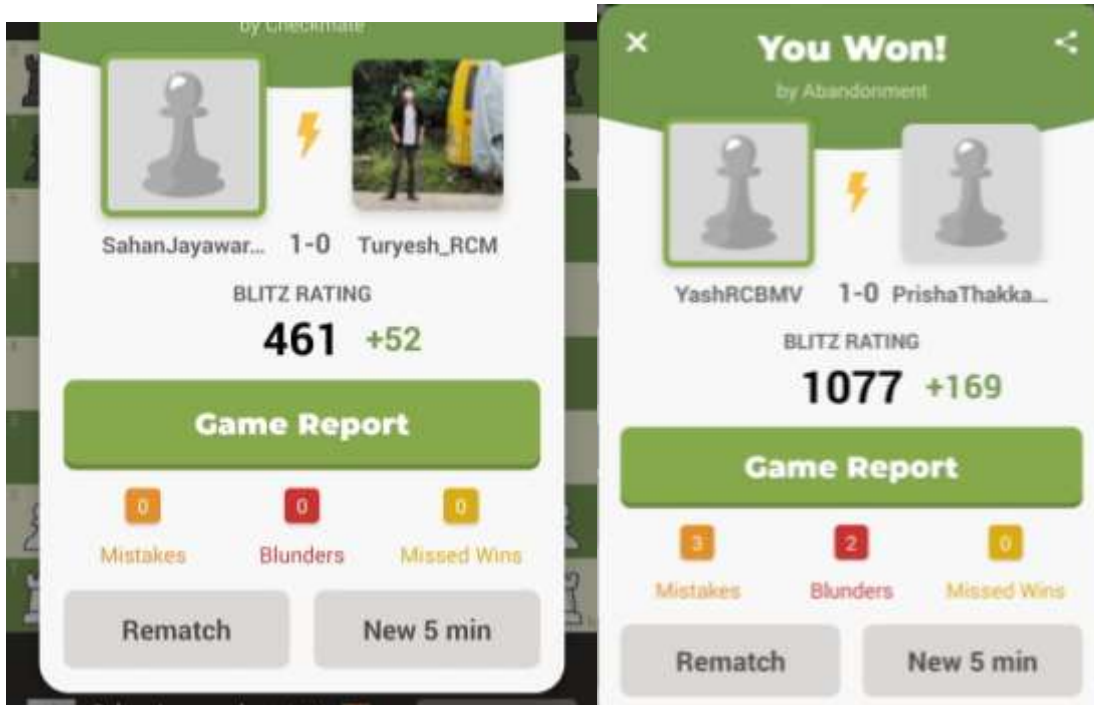

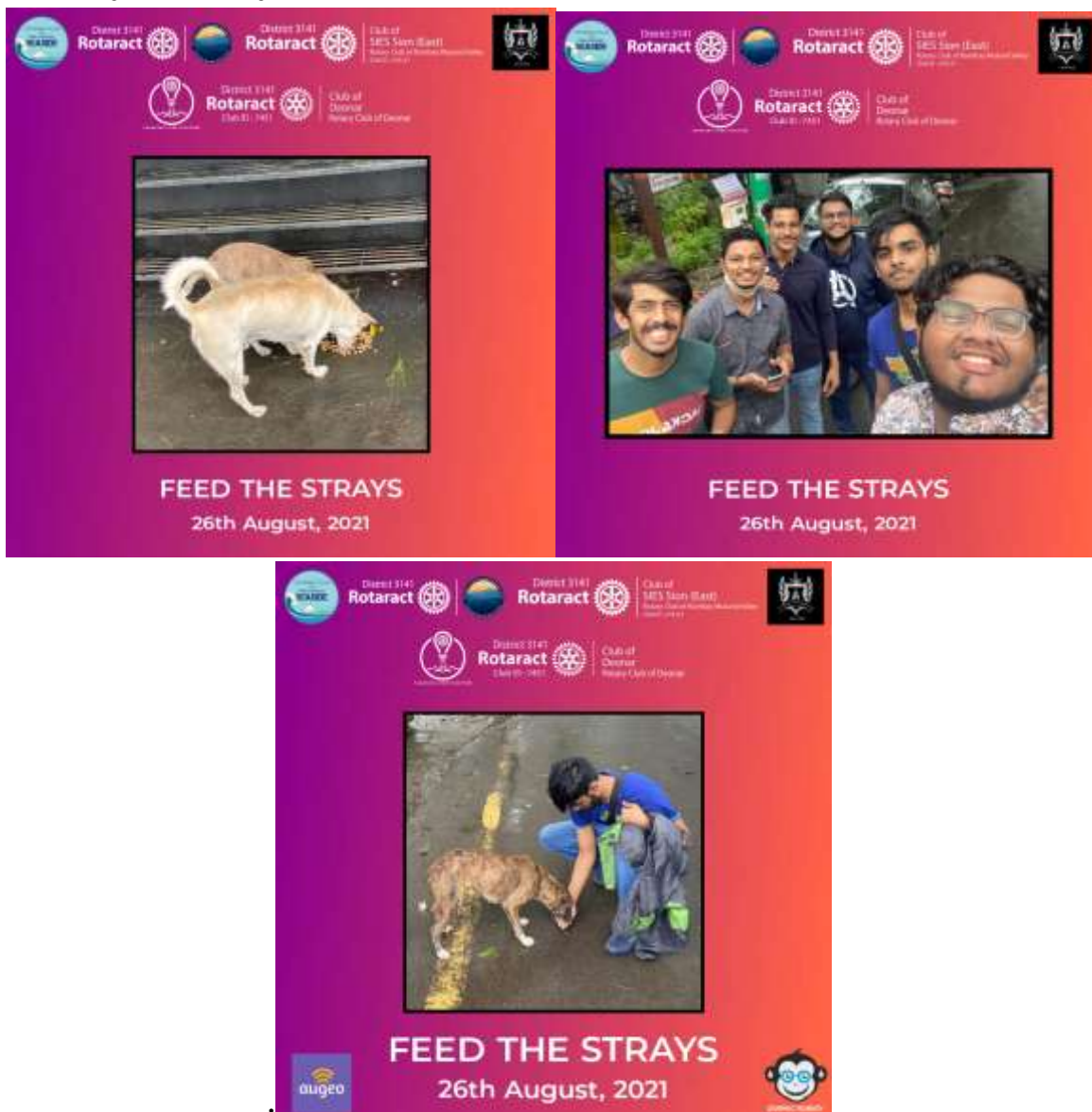

Feed the stray - International Service



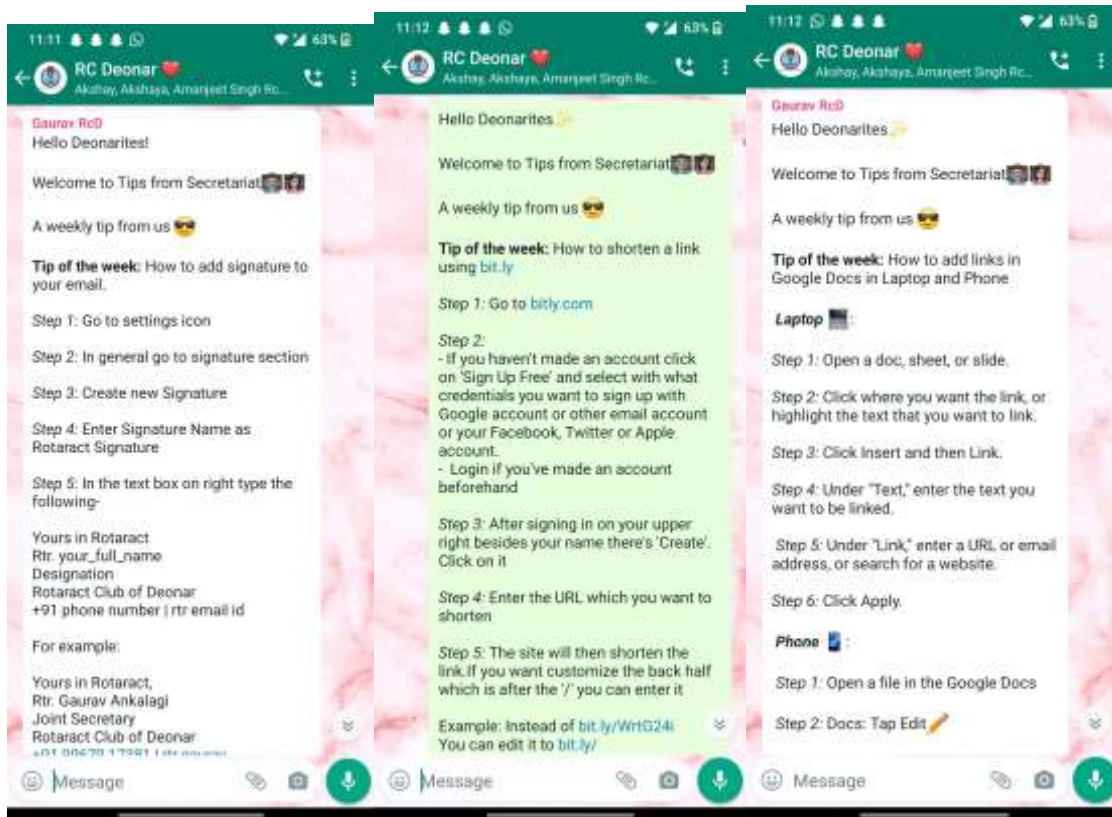

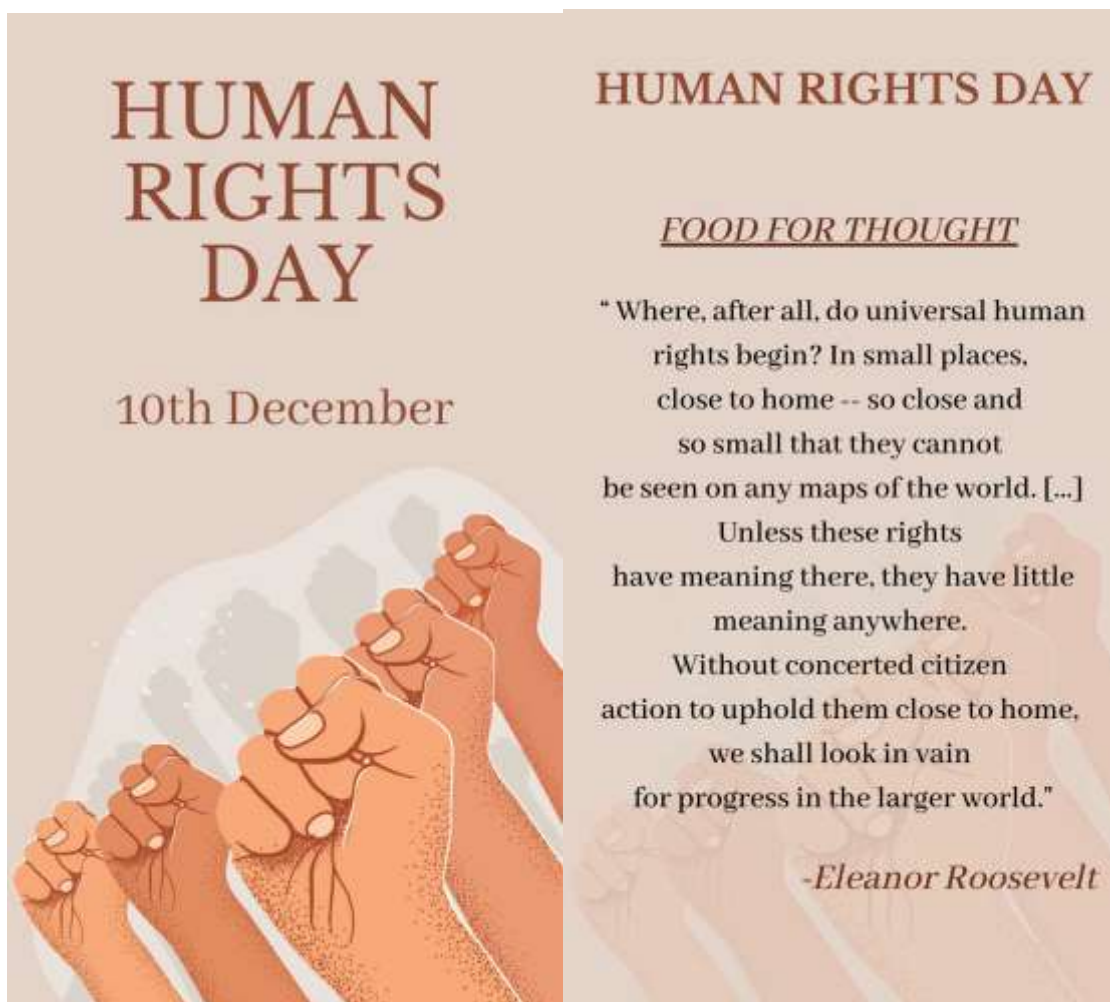
Future frugal - International Service and Professional Development

Problem Statement



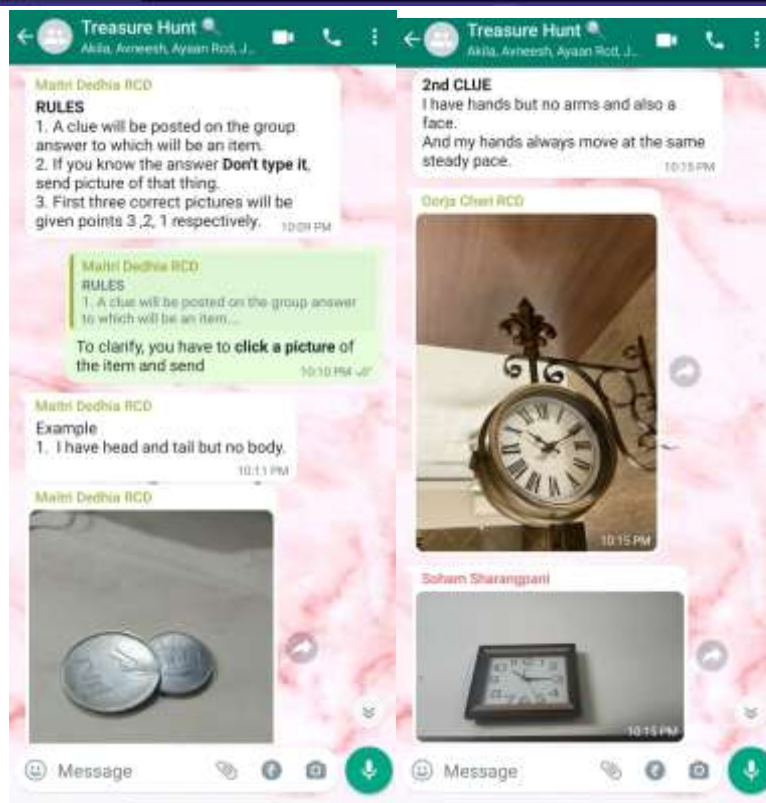
- There are many patients diagnosed each day with blood cancer. The best possible cure for a blood cancer patient is a Stem Cell transplant.
- The Stem Cell donation should come from a person who is a complete DNA match with the patient.
- Hence we try to match with the siblings first as the possibility of finding a match among siblings is 1:4. (only 25% chances).
- But that also fails many a times (75%) or the patient does not have siblings.

Along with having a fun time and laugh, everyone enjoyed a break from their busy weekly schedules. A group was made specifically for this activity and all the interested people had to join the group. 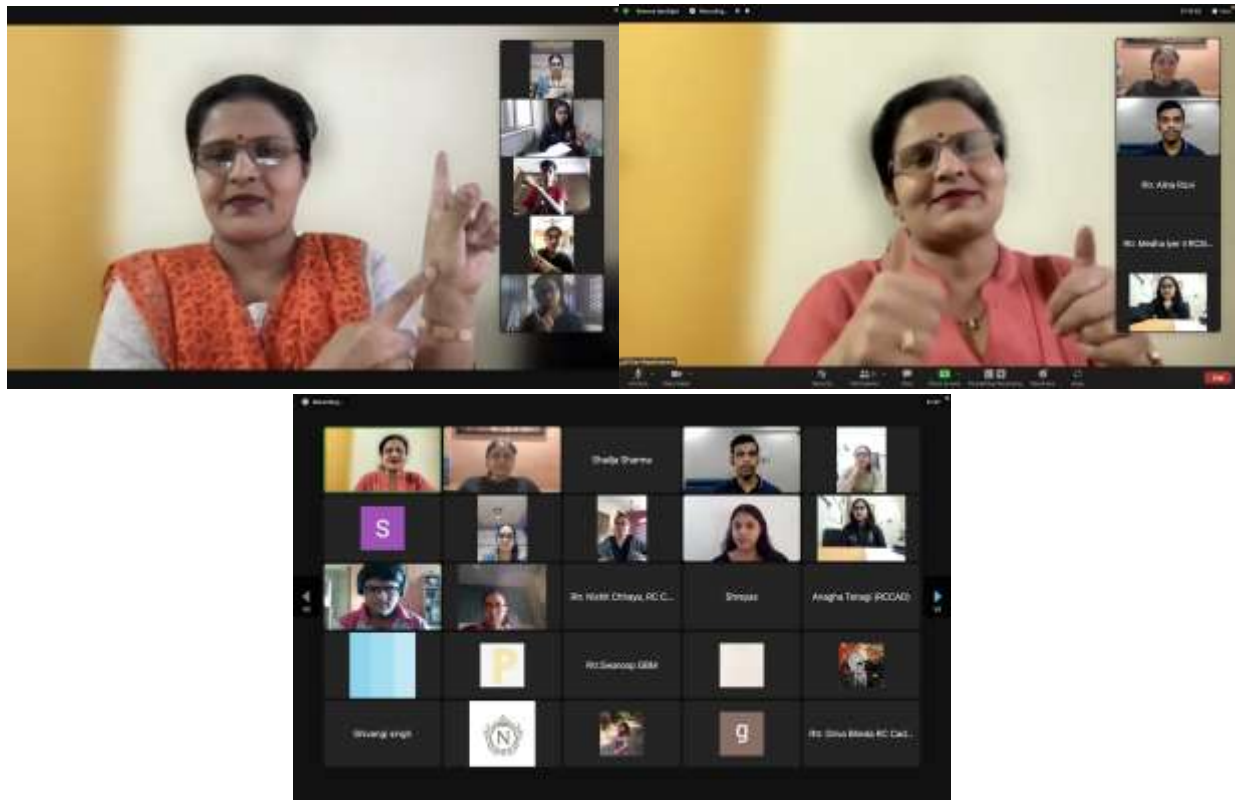
- a) Alphabets
